Masking Update - After March 11, masks will no longer be required to be worn at school.

<u>Planning For 2022-2023</u> - if you or someone you know plans to enroll a child in transitional kindergarten or kindergarten in the fall, please call Miss Trudi in the office. In order to qualify for kindergarten, a child must turn 5 by September 1, 2022. Transitional Kindergarten age requirements are changing. The new age requirements for TK will be phased in over the next 4 years. By 2025-2026, all 4 year olds will be eligible for transitional kindergarten. For next year, the 2022-2023 school year, 4 year olds are eligible for transitional kindergarten if they will turn 5 by February 2, 2023.

<u>Early Bears</u> - we understand that sometimes you must drop your child off early at school. Staff members are not on duty until 8:00 when breakfast service begins. Prior to 8:00 AM, children are not supervised on campus.

<u>Gym Updates</u> - the gym site work is moving along at a great pace. Construction of the new gymnasium will begin in May, in conjunction with continued site work. We thank you for adhering to the student drop off and pick up guidelines - using the designated area to drop off and pick up, and then turning left down Church Street. For the safety of your child and others, please do not pull up to, or into, the staff parking lot, and please do not drop off your child in the back alley. Thank you for keeping our students and staff safe!
