

Homework Expectations

Kindergarten is a new and fun beginning for students and parents. It is also a great opportunity for your child to learn and practice good homework/study habits. To begin, students should be seated in a quiet place, away from other siblings and distractions. When working on homework, it is very important to spend time helping your child read the directions and make sure they understand what is being asked of them. This will ensure that their homework is done correctly (all directions are written at the top or bottom of each page). Before your child turns in his/her homework, help them double check to make sure that it is complete and accurate.

Each homework page is expected to be completed neatly and accurately. All homework should be completed with a **PENCIL** or **CRAYONS** (when asked to color). Pens do not allow students to erase their mistakes and markers bleed through the paper making it difficult to correct. In class and at home, I expect students to do their best job on all of their homework. It should be neat, with no other markings/drawings on the page.

Handwriting - Please use pencil when competing handwriting (unless stated otherwise). You can help your child with handwriting by making sure that your child always starts at the top of the line, puts 2 finger spaces between each letter and that all letters are written between the lines. If your child is needing extra help with independent practice, use a highlighter to write the letter/number, then have them trace over it with pencil (be sure they are using top-bottom letter formation).
